Club and Group Entries

Class 1 Entry Fee: Free

Prizes: 1st £75; 2nd £50; 3rd £25; 4th £5

The entry must be staged by 7.00 pm on Tuesday 28th June and not removed before 6.30 pm on Saturday 2nd July

1 Club Collective Exhibit. Provide and stage a **1 metre cubed** cubicle to the theme of **‘A Royal Celebration for the Queen’s Jubilee’**.

Contents of the exhibit: To be made up of **five** individual craft items, **one** from **each** category.

- Craft 1 - Floral Art. Any item using cut flowers and accessories in a suitable container.
- Craft 2 – Cookery/Baking. This craft will be tasted so must be covered with cling film.
- Craft 3 – Textile Handicraft. Knitwear, tailored or crochet for example.
- Craft 4 – Natural Handicraft. Any item using wood, metal, clay, glass, stone or shell for example.
- Craft 5 – Art. An item that could include photography, a graphic or a picture in any medium.

The five crafts included in the exhibit must be clearly numbered 1 to 5 together with the heading the craft comes under. The items are marked separately and the Member who made the highest placed item in each of the categories will

receive a trophy for Best Individual Item. These items must have been made/produced by YFC members since the 2021 Show. Any other items/materials may be used in the display to interpret the theme.

A separate form will be sent with your tickets and must be completed by competitors, listing the items for judging, together with the names of the Members responsible for making/producing those items. This is to be handed in on Tuesday 28th June. All the five craft items must have a sticker placed on them to notify which items are to be judged; these will also be sent with the tickets.

Tables on which to place the cubes will be supplied, but not the cubes themselves, and an electric socket, **which must be booked at the time of entry**, can be provided and attention will be taken into account in the overall judging. Cubicles may be partially set up, at the Club’s own risk, on Monday 27th June, between 2pm and 7pm and must be completed on **Tuesday 28th June between 12pm and 7pm**. Please note that **cubes must not exceed 1 metre measured externally** in any direction, including any drawing pins, other decoration or part of the structure. Cubes that are oversized will be disqualified immediately and no part of the cube or its contents will be judged. Clubs must have their cubes signed off by the Cubicle Steward (to check re size and individual items) before leaving the marquee.

It is hoped that all Clubs will try to enter this competition and make every effort to stage their exhibit, complying with the above specifications. Please forward entries for this class to the Devon YFC Centre, Amory Building, Cheriton Bishop, Exeter, EX6 6JH by Friday 27th May 2022. Please Note: Exhibits are to be removed on Saturday between 6.30pm and 8.30pm.

Groups to decorate a timber pedestrian 3 foot wide (5 bar) gate to showcase your groups activities and achievements throughout the previous year. Both sides of the gate may be decorated. The gate will be provided at the Show. The gate needs to be ready for judging by 7pm on Tuesday 28th June.

3 Club Promotion Board

Clubs to decorate a 1m x 1m board to promote their Club's activities covering the period June 2021 to June 2022. To be ready for judging at 7pm on Tuesday 28th June

10 'Ready, Steady, Cook' Group Cookery Competition (to be held in the YFC Marquee)

Theme 'HRH Queen Elizabeth 2nd's Platinum Jubilee'

Maximum Two Teams per Group

Prizes: 1st £50 2nd £30 3rd £20

Each team will be required to prepare and display four courses for a Gala Dinner celebrating HRH Queen Elizabeth 2nd's Platinum Jubilee, courses should include local produce where possible. Teams should promote produce local to them and evidence of locality should be included in the overall display. The menu must include at least one sweet course and one savoury course. Each course will be required to serve two people. A drink does not count as a course and will not be scored. Teams must ensure each course involves a cooked element, prepared from raw ingredients, demonstrating cookery skills. (It is advised that the combination of smoked salmon and cream cheese is not included). Teams to consist of three members, one must be 28 years of age or under, one must be 21 years of age or under and one must be 16 years of age or under, on 1 September 2021, and full members of a Club affiliated to NFYFC.

Equipment: two rings will be provided per team, no other heat or power points allowed, with a table/work area. Competitors will be required to provide:

- a) All equipment other than table and cooking rings.
- b) All ingredients (these may be brought to the competition already weighed out and vegetables ready washed)
- c) A menu card (stating where the ingredients have come from where possible)

Butter & Junket Making

PLEASE NOTE: These classes will be held in the YFC Marquee on Saturday 2nd July from 10am

Depending on the number of entries please note that the 22-28 years Junket making class may be held at the same time as the 21 and Under Butter making class.

Entry Fee: Free

Prizes: 1st £5; 2nd £3; 3rd £2

An admission ticket to the show on Saturday 2nd July will be provided for all competitors in the butter and junket making classes. The show admission tickets for Saturday 2nd July can be collected from the YFC Marquee on Tuesday 28th June 2pm - 7pm, Wednesday 29th June 12 pm – 6 pm or during the show on Thursday or Friday. Please advise if you require the ticket posted to you.

Please note that if a ticket has been collected/posted and the member does not compete an admission fee of £7.50 will be payable.

Competitors to make up to 20 fluid ounces of cream into one ½lb block and remainder to competitors own choice. Time allowed - 45 minutes, to include preparation and washing up of utensils. Competitors to provide their own bowl, wooden spoon, spatula and whisk. Cream and other utensils will be provided.

Please note that the senior U28 junket making class may be held at the same time as the junior U21 Butter making class.

13 Junket Making (21 & under)

For competitors who are aged 21 years & under on 1st September 2021.

14 Junket Making (22-28 years)

For competitors who are aged over 21 years of age and 28 & under on 1st September 2021.

Competitors to make a Junket from one pint of milk in individual containers (supplied). Competitors to supply their own nutmeg, grater, dessert spoon, sugar and milk. Other utensils and rennet will be provided. Time allowed 30 minutes, to include preparation and washing up of utensils.

Travel Reports

Set Recipe: Rocky Road

INGREDIENTS

- 125 grams soft butter
- 300 grams best-quality dark chocolate (minimum 70% cocoa solids) broken into pieces
- 3 tablespoons golden syrup
- 200 grams rich tea biscuits
- 100 grams mini marshmallows
- 2 teaspoons icing sugar (for dusting)

METHOD

1. Gently melt the butter, chocolate and golden syrup in a heavy-based saucepan. Scoop out about 125ml / ½ cup of this melted mixture and put to one side.
2. Put the biscuits into a freezer bag and then bash them with a rolling pin. You are aiming for both crumbs and pieces of biscuits.
3. Fold the biscuit pieces and crumbs into the melted chocolate mixture in the saucepan, and then add the marshmallows.
4. Tip into a foil tray (24cm / 9 inch square); flatten as best you can with a spatula. Pour the reserved 125ml / ½ cup of melted chocolate mixture over the marshmallow mixture and smooth the top.
5. Refrigerate for about 2 hours or overnight.
6. Cut into 24 fingers and dust with icing sugar by pushing it gently through a tea strainer or small sieve.
7. 6 fingers to be presented for judging at the show

- Animals to be on the Showground by 7pm on Wednesday or to arrive on the morning of Friday 1st July and remain until 4pm on Saturday 2nd July.
- Please see TB Regulation No 19 under Regulations in this schedule.
- Livestock Competitors are also reminded of the Commercial Beef classes that are held on Friday 1st July and the Young Handler classes for cattle are on Saturday 2nd July.
- Exhibitors may only enter one animal in each class
- Please note Class 67 - YFC Livestock Stockmanship will be judged on Friday 1st July. For entries in this class, animals may be brought into the showground on Friday morning and will then stay until Saturday afternoon. Exhibits must comply with Cattle TB regulations and Goats will need correct CAE requirements.

67 YFC Livestock Stockmanship class for YFC Reared Beef and Dairy Cattle, Sheep and Goats to be judged on Friday 1st July. Open to Beef and Dairy Cattle and to Goats and Sheep, of any breed that has been reared by a YFC member since birth, born before 1st May 2021. Animals to be judged on presentation and condition only. During judging the member will be asked some questions about the breeding, rearing and training of the animal from birth. The animal must be shown by the member that has reared the animal. Any animal must remain registered on the same holding between the close of entries date and the 2022 Show.

YFC Beef and Dairy Classes to be exhibited by a member of a Young Farmers' Club. Any animal entered must remain registered on the same holding between close of entries date and the 2022 show.

Entries accepted on the day. Valid membership cards must be shown, no card – no entry. **Novice is not to have previously been placed 1st – 4th at the County Show.** Classes may be split/amalgamated depending on entries. Trophies will be confined to members of DFYFC. Prize cards and prize money awarded to all competitors.

Please note that stockjudging competitors do not automatically qualify for an admission ticket to the show, however you may pre order a ticket at £7.50 for entrance to the show on Saturday. The ticket can be collected from the YFC marquee on Tuesday 28th June, Wednesday 29th June or on Thursday or Friday during the show.

All stockjudging entrants are required to complete a supplementary stockjudging entry form confirming name, membership number, club, age as at 1st September 2021 and whether a novice entrant or not for the different classes. Forms will be sent to pre-entered competitors and will also be provided on the day.

Stockman of the Year/Young Stockjudge of the Year

Regulations Applicable to all Classes

1. All entries must be made on the Official Entry Form and accompanied by the appropriate entry fees. One entry form per competitor.
2. Every exhibitor and competitor will be held responsible for the correctness of his entry form.
3. Unless otherwise stated, all classes will be OPEN to competitors who are 28 years of age and under as at 1st September 2021.
4. The closing date for entries is **Friday 27th May for entries online at www.devoncountyshow.co.uk**
5. No exhibits may bear any identification as to origin.
6. All exhibits to be the Bona Fide work of the exhibitors.
7. Exhibits not complying with the conditions laid down will be disqualified.
8. Substitution will not be allowed.
9. Exhibitors will be restricted to **one** entry per class.
10. **Where TEN or more classes are entered and staged by a member an entrance ticket valid for one day's admission to the Show will be given, unless already allowed for as a competitor. Tickets to be collected by the competitor on Tuesday 28th June once all their entries in classes are staged. Stockjudging entries can count towards the ten classes.**
11. The Judges are instructed to withhold prizes where the entry is not of sufficient merit and in awarding prizes; they are further instructed to make their awards according to the relevant merits of the exhibit.
12. The Judge's decision will be final.
13. Exhibits in classes 1-7 and 17 – 66 must be staged between 2.00 pm and 7.00 pm on **Tuesday 28th June.**
14. **Trophies** (including those for stockjudging) will be presented at 5.30 pm on Saturday 2nd July in the YFC marquee. DCAA Trophies may be retained until 1st March in the year following the award, when they must be returned with their boxes in good condition to the Association's Office at Westpoint, Clyst St Mary, Exeter.
15. **Prize Money** will be forwarded to clubs for distribution to individuals after the show.
16. **Collection of Exhibits.** Entries **must not** be removed before **6.30 pm** on Saturday 2nd July. **Any items not claimed by 8.30 pm will be disposed of** unless prior arrangements with Devon YFC show team have been made.
17. Whilst every care will be taken of the exhibits, neither the Association nor the Devon YFC will be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.
18. All exhibits in static classes must not have been shown at any previous Devon County Show and to have been made/produced since the 2021 Show.
19. **TB PRE MOVEMENT TESTING**
ALL cattle coming to the Show must have had a pre movement test with a negative result within 60 days of the commencement of the Show. This requirement will NOT apply to calves under 42 days of age on the day of arrival at the Show.
20. The Committee reserves the right to amalgamate or cancel classes with insufficient entries.
