Honiton and Totnes Young Farmers took the two top spots in the drama competition, with both Haldon and Exe Valley choirs both progressing in the choir competition too. We also saw brilliant disco dance performances from Cruwys Morchard and Cheriton and Tedburn, coming 2nd and 3rd respectively.

Dan Grist, Devon YFC Chairman, adds: "Young Farmers is clearly so much more than just farming! I was so proud to see our members excel in so many competitions during the South West Area weekend.

"The performing arts competitions in particular are the best way to bring
