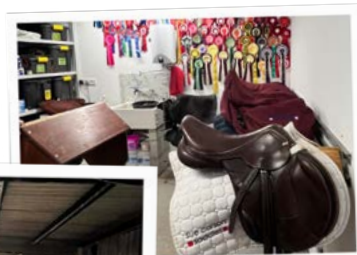
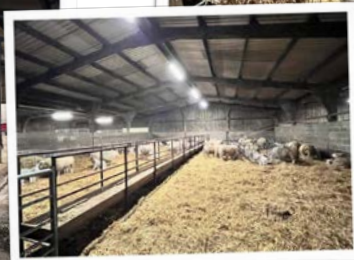
EAST DEVON YFC

A huge thank you must go to Trev from Centre Stage School for all of his hard work and efforts into this years production.

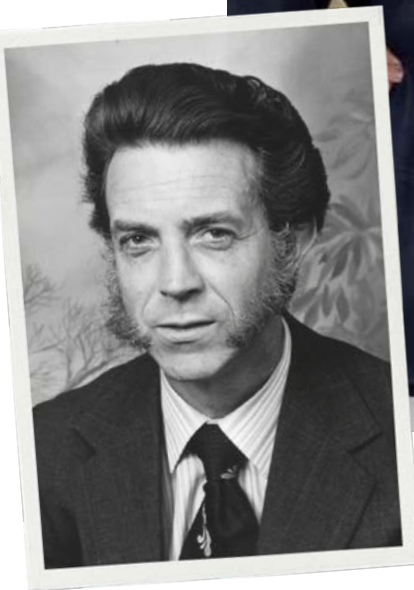

David Baker County Organiser - Devon Federation of Young Farmers Clubs 1975 – 1987

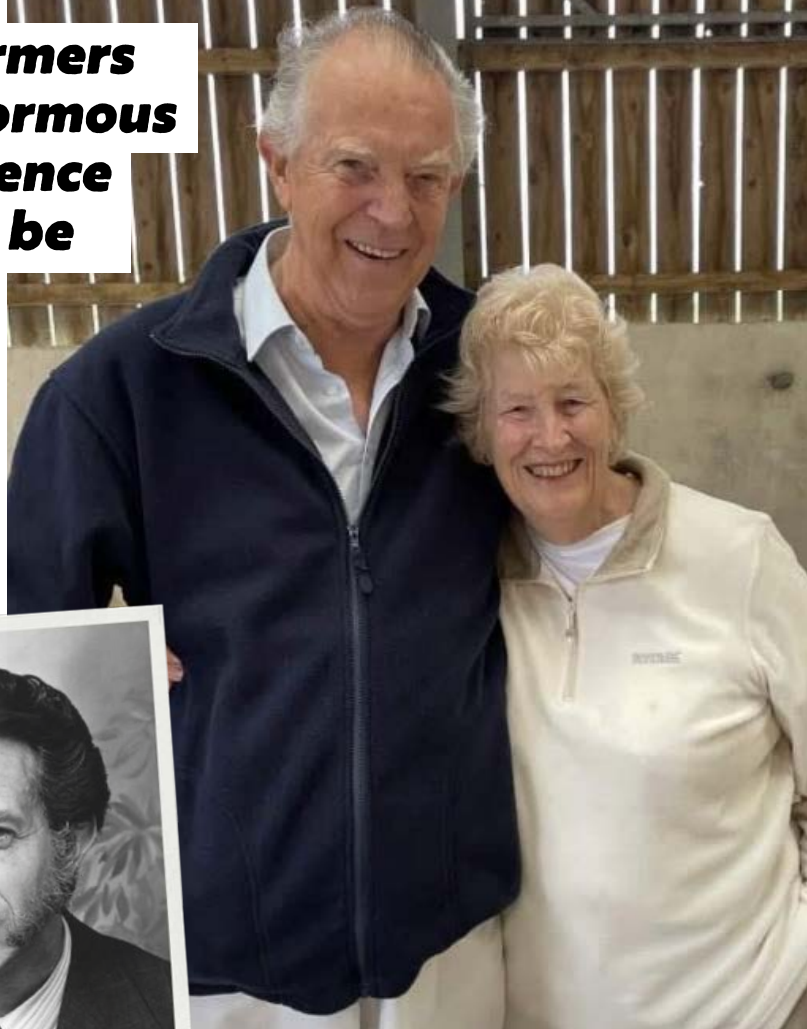
It is with great sadness that we have learnt of the passing of David Baker.

David joined us at Devon YFC in 1975 as our County Organiser after the retirement of the long serving Organiser, Tug Wilson MBE. David came with all his experience having worked at National YFC as the Competitions Secretary prior to this appointment. David joined Devon at a time when YFC was flourishing, and at a time when the Federation was building and moving our Headquarters to the newly completed Amory Building in the Old Exeter Market.

David Baker was a man of tremendous foresight and thought, initiating many new ideas with the members. David was definitely an organiser by name and an organiser by trade! His organisational ability was second to none, and any event, meeting, competition or function



which had David's name on it was always a huge success. The large County Rallies which moved around the county, or with the many coach loads of members going to the National AGM or maybe competitions are just a few examples of this.



During David's time as Organiser the Federation was booming, seeing the membership rising to well over 4000 and the number of clubs increased as well. His development of the School Club network was also an important phase of YFC at that time, with five clubs starting in 1978 and another five in 1979. Another innovation was the start of the hugely successful County Stockjudging Day in 1981, promoting a skill that Devon was renowned for nationally. In the same year the Federation celebrated the Diamond Jubilee and David again was key to all the celebrations.

The initiation and organisation of travel opportunities for members was one of David's passions. In addition to arranging all the Annual Travel Scholarship details, David was instrumental in organising worldwide holiday exchange trips for member groups as well. In 1981 a trip to New Zealand, and another to Western Canada, with a second to Canada a couple of years later. Needless to say with all the arrangements done by David, the





organisation of these was meticulous and a memorable and educational time was had by the many members who went.

In 1986 the Federation assisted in the organisation of the Duke of

Edinburgh Awards Scheme from the office as well, at a time when funding from Devon County Council was being looked at more closely. David left the post of Organiser in 1987 after 12 years to become the Senior Youth Advisor for Devon County Council. He stayed involved with many aspects of YFC however, and was elected as a Vice President in 2010.

As Organiser, David said himself he was always mindful of the future needs of the membership and that the Federation should always be evolving, but not to change for the sake of change! David once wrote that it was his belief that 'the essence with membership was to ensure all clubs are maintained to be an efficient and happy atmosphere which will ensure new members join, stay and gain full benefit from their membership'. During David's tenure of office he spread this so

successfully and we as a Federation continue to benefit from his thinking.

The Devon Federation was blessed to have had David as its organiser for 12 years, but his involvement also in the wider community with Youth, Agriculture, Shows and of course his love of Steam Trains has meant Devon has been well blessed for his commitment to our County. So many of us will all have very special memories of how David has influenced our own particular lives.

We send our sincere condolences to Jill and the Family and we know just how much David will be missed by so many.

I first met David Baker as a very young member of Newton St Cyres YFC, in the Barn Owl pub (now the Beer Engine) which he lived next to in the old station house. Having taken on as Club Treasurer I was having some difficulty in reconciling the club accounts and he immediately offered assistance and support. It was that, and other encouragement over many years that started my YFC career beyond club level and for which I shall be forever grateful.

As an officer you knew you could turn up at any county event and everything would be meticulously organised, a briefing prepared and you only had to front the occasion and when you got it wrong, he would tell you in a way that would improve you next time.

I have been fortunate to keep in touch with David and Jill as they often took their preferred form of transport, the train, from Barnstaple to Crediton to have coffee in the Mole Avon store.

Apart from the AGM a few weeks ago, as a shareholder he never missed a meeting and you knew the questions he would ask would be searching, relevant and certainly test your knowledge.

Thousands of Young Farmers over the years owe an enormous debt to David for his patience and skill in shaping us to be better YFC members and thereby of our community and I for one will be eternally grateful.

CLUB OF THE MONTH

MESHAW YFC

Supported by **SOUTH WEST Farmer**

Meshaw YFC are an incredibly active club with over 50 members. So far this year they have been busy holding local events such as a bingo and ferret racing, as well as socials including a trip to watch Exeter Chiefs.

However, it's the impact of Meshaw YFC's charity work that has been the most impressive. Back in 2023, the club raised £4,000 for Cardiac Risk in the Young (CRY), a charity which aims to prevent young sudden cardiac deaths through awareness, screening and research, as well as support affected families.

Meshaw YFC made a lasting impression on the charity, who were incredibly grateful for their donation. More recently the charity reached out to the club and suggested that these funds went towards the club holding their own two-day screening.

The screening was available to 14-35 year olds, and acts as a simple way to diagnose most cardiac abnormalities. 12 young people die a week from an unknown cardiac condition, so Meshaw YFC wanted to not only raise awareness of

this, but also provide a service to local young people that could potentially save a life.

Kathryn Manley, Meshaw YFC's Club Secretary, says: "As a club we're incredibly proud of our charity work, so when a representative from CRY came to a club meeting and suggested we could hold our own cardiac screening, we jumped at the chance.

"We had over 200 people book in for a screening and we're proud to be supporting our local community in this way.

"We originally wanted to support this charity, because several of our members had close connections to individuals that sadly lost their lives due to cardiac conditions. It means a lot that we can do something positive in the local community that can really make a difference."

"It feels amazing that the funds that we raised for charity went directly into a service that supported our members and other young people in North Devon."
